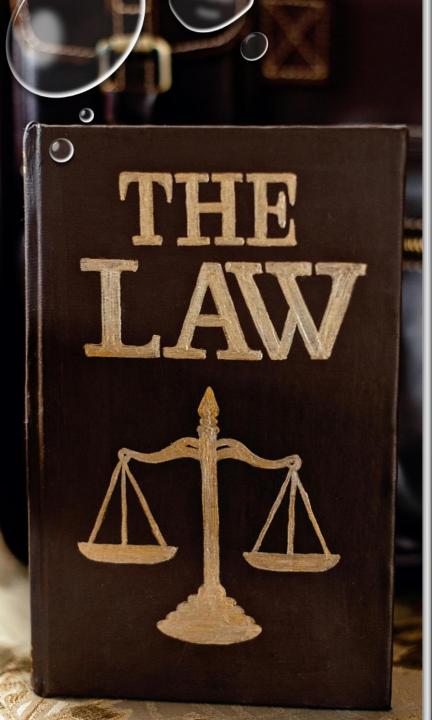

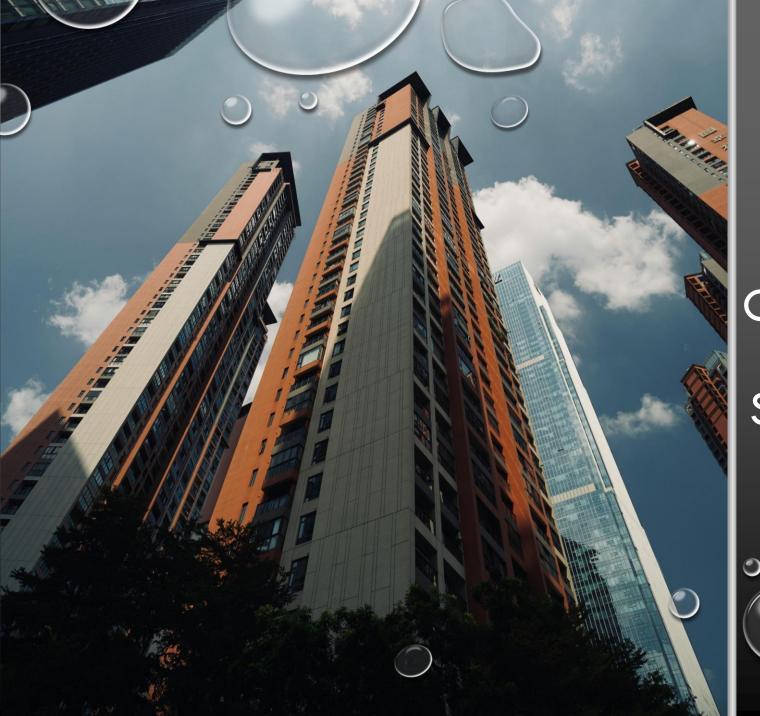
- Examine the scope and principles of an organization's Anti-Bribery and Anti-Corruption (ABAC) Policy
